## ORIGINAL CONCEPT & APPLICATION


- BID has been working since 2020
- Broken into 4 phases
- Improvements shown from Cuming to Fowler
- Improvements Include:
  - sidewalks, traffic flow, landscaping, parking, and multimodal transit





## HUD – FY 2022 CPF

- Project Limits:
  - Ohio to Patrick
  - Zone 2
- Total Cost: \$3.6M
  - Grant: \$3.0M
  - City Match: \$600k
- Important Dates:
  - Dec 23, 2022 to Aug 31, 2030








# NDOT – FHWA CPF

- Project Limits:
  - Ohio to Sahler
  - Zone 3 & 4
- Total Cost: \$5.0M
  - Grant: \$4M
  - City Match: \$1M
- Important Dates:
  - Bid by: Sept 30, 2026








## SCHEDULE OVERVIEW

- Construction schedule will be determined during design


# **Key Steps in the Process of Completing a Local Project**







# STANDARD NDOT PROJECT SCHEDULE



Complex Project: Major urban/rural reconstruction project. New facility project. New viaduct or bridge project. Major bridge replacement project. (Most likely an EA or EIS with major ROW taking)

Intermediate Project: Typical urban/rural improvement project. Typical bridge rehab./replacement project. Enhancement projects. Safe Routes Nebraska projects.

(Most likely a CE with minor ROW taking)

Simple Project: Hazard Elimination improvement project. Roadway resurfacing/maintenance project. Traffic signal installation project. (Most likely a PCE with no ROW taking)



#### Project Schedule Timeline






#### 33rd Street and Hamilton Street Intersection (OPW 54100)

#### **About the Project**

The 33rd Street and Hamilton Street intersection is planned to be reconstructed as a mini-roundabout in order to improve safety and reduce traveling speeds while removing a currently unwarranted traffic signal. The project will include new pavement, sidewalk improvements, ADA curb ramps, raised medians, and storm sewer improvements.
